- Work alongside the CLF to coordinate and execute key advocacy events/milestones throughout the school year (1-2 per semester)
- Lead advocacy initiatives on campus and within the community

Communications

- Meet with a CLF staff member once per month, as a platform to:
 - Discuss new ideas/initiatives, brainstorm next steps
 - o Communicate concerns on behalf of the chapter
 - Collaborate with chapter presidents from other Canadian universities
- Act as the chair for all chapter executive meetings, coordinate/delegate duties appropriately to executive team, communicate major outcomes from meetings with CLF staff member
- Lead biweekly meetings for general members; establish and enforce guidelines and expectations for chapter executives
- Support the executive team in completing their roles via goal development and regular check-ins
